

Regional Economic Development Area 5 into It's 12th Month of Apprenticeship Expansion Grant: This is What We've Accomplish Thus Far!

In July 2020 BEST, Inc. was awarded \$123,216.00 as part of the State of Illinois' Apprentice-ship Expansion effort to provide outreach to the companies of the 2 workforce areas (LWIA 4 and LWIA 13) within Regional Economic Development Area #5 (Jo Daviess, Carroll, Whiteside, Lee, LaSalle, Putnam, Bureau, Henry, Rock Island and Mercer Counties). Over these last 11+ months efforts by the Regional Apprenticeship Navigator, Nikelle Tellier, have resulted in: 6 virtual out reach sector events being held, 138 individuals from area companies contact either through the group events or individually via partner referrals, 16 apprentices trained through Title 1 WIOA Incumbent Training Funds with the possibility of an additional 2 more currently in the pipeline, the connecting of a potential registered high school program with interested businesses, and staff are eagerly awaiting the signing of their first newly established program in the agriculture sector. Efforts will continue under the current grant through December 31, 2021.

A second round of grant applications is being anticipated with BEST already planning to gather partnering entities to brainstorm the next grant application. In addition to applying for a second navigator grant, BEST has also been encouraged to apply to become an intermediary. Intermediaries serve as sponsors of registered apprenticeship programs. BEST is considering applying for this opportunity and would like to focus on expanding registered high school programs with the 10 county region. Updates will be made available as this second round of funding unfolds.
