



PY 21 NCI Works Local Award Recipients: Individual Achievement





In May of 2020, Ashleigh contacted the BEST, Inc. office in Sterling to inquire about getting assistance with the cost of the nursing program at Highland Community College. She was a single mother and underemployed in the health care field. Her goal was to pursue a nursing license in order to have a more fulfilling job and a much higher income. Ashleigh was determined eligible for WIOA services as a low-income adult and was able to get help from BEST, Inc. with tuition assistance and mileage reimbursement. She drove back and forth to Freeport and/or Rockford three days a week for 2 years, which would not have been possible for her to afford without the travel reimbursement that BEST, Inc. provided. Ashleigh excelled in her classes and graduated in May of 2022. She will be taking the state boards soon in order to become a registered nurse.

Cheyenne Cantu:



Cheyenne began the BEST, Inc. Program in March of 2021. She was placed in a Work Experience (W/E) at the Rock Falls Chamber of Commerce in Rock Falls, Illinois. During her Work Experience, she was a student at Sterling High School, completed and was certified as a CNA, and successfully graduated from Sterling High School. She achieved all this while navigating a learning disability that, at times, made her work harder to meet her goals. Her goal is to work in the medical field as a Radiological and Ultrasound Technician. During her time at the Rock Falls Chamber of Commerce she was an integral part of their small staff. She learned numerous skills that will help her in her future career. She learned: the importance of prioritizing her workload, customer service, assisting and calming difficult customers, organization, work-life balance, organizing communi-

ty events, assisting and supervising volunteers, stress reduction, planning and preparation. She has an outgoing and enthusiastic attitude that was contagious to staff and volunteers. She did such a good job that when her W/E was done she was hired by the chamber for temporary work with their Summer Splash Event. Her supervisors have said that Cheyenne is always willing to do hard work which can be rare in today's workplace. She will work outside in hot and/or cold weather and does not complain. She has the rare quality of always looking for more work and not complaining about hard work.

Hannah Kaltenbrun:



Hannah Kaltenbrun was referred to BEST Inc. by her STEP counselor, Toby Luxton, for assistance with employment. Hannah was going to graduate high school soon and was unsure of her next steps. Toby felt she would be a wonderful candidate for the paid work experience program because it would help her ease into permanent employment. Hannah was especially interested in working with young children but did not have experience and it was difficult to find a worksite in her small community due to COVID restrictions. She was eventually referred by BEST Inc. to a local restaurant to assist with back of the house duties such as dishwashing, cleaning, stocking and other duties as assigned. She was hired through the BEST Inc. work experience program and learned many skills at the restaurant. She

learned how to manage a work schedule that changed each week, she performed tasks she had never done before and she learned how workers in a restaurant have to work together. Hannah was learning many skills but she didn't like the job. She stuck with it to build a work history and when her training hours ended, she was eager to seek other opportunities.

Hannah said she was still interested in working with young children. The BEST Inc. Youth Job Developer, Diamond Merboth, knocked on doors until she found a business that was interested in meeting Hannah. The meeting went well and a new work experience for Hannah was developed with Best Beginnings in Oregon, IL. Due to Hannah's prior work experience, we were very aware of Hannah's strengths and challenges and were able to work with the supervisor, Tiffany, at Best Beginnings to customize a learning experience that would allow Hannah's strengths to shine and provide opportunities for her to learn new skills. It was a great partnership. Hannah did indeed shine with all the supports in place. Upon completion of her training hours, Hannah was permanently hired. When asked what she loves most about her job, she said she love working with the kids and working with her coworkers. She plans to stay at Best Beginnings for a very, very long time.
